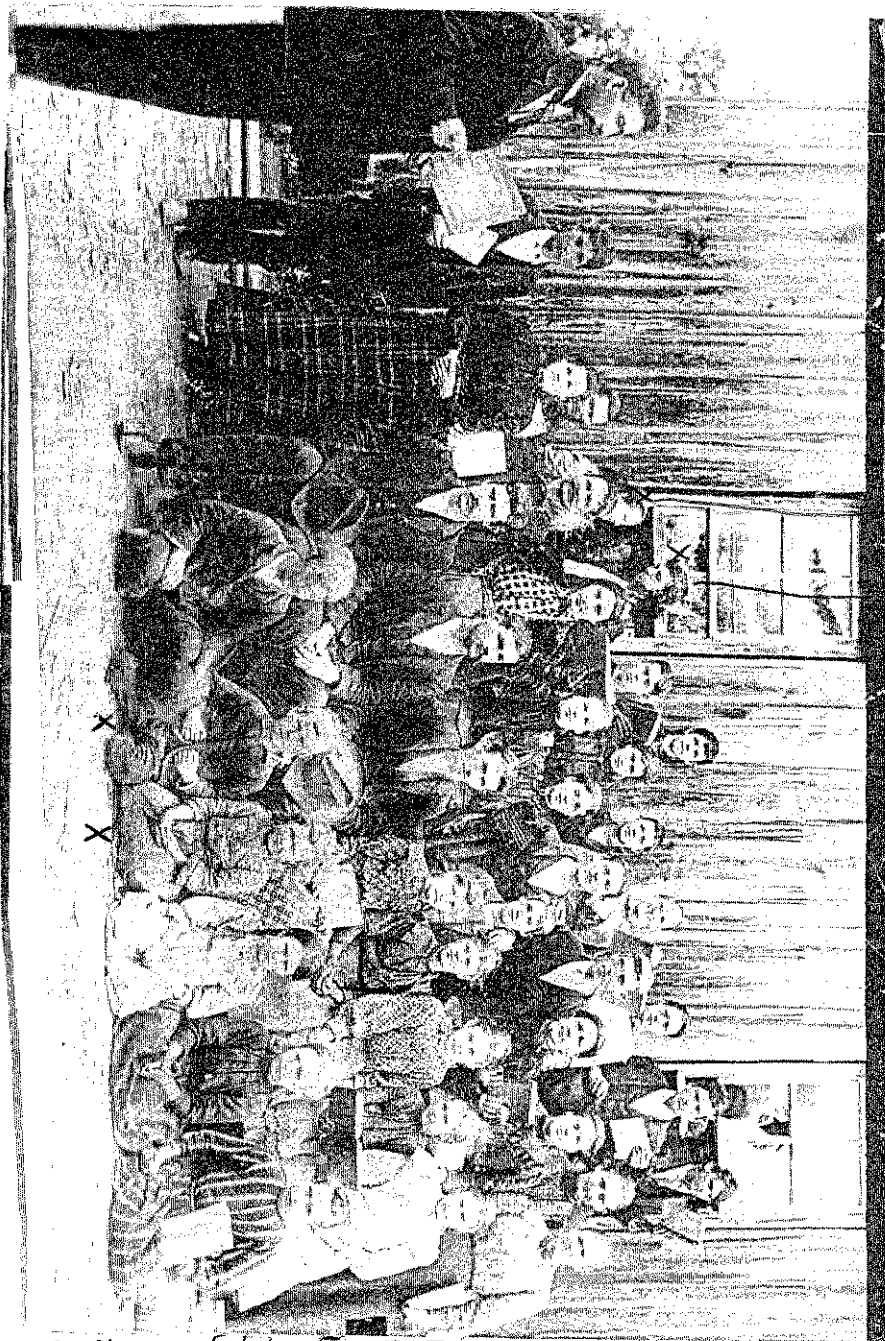


Singing School group about 1900, side of

This indenture made and entered into this the 10th day of March 1888 between J. L. Keeter and P. J. Gaddis of the one part and Mt. Pisgah Baptist Church of the second part all of said state and county witness that for and in consideration of the place of divine worship we the said Keeter and Gaddis grants, bargains, and conveys to said church for the purpose above mentioned to the following plot of ground:

Situated on the south side of lot no. 38 in the 12th district and 2nd section the conditional line commencing at a chestnut tree northeast of the churchyard, thence south to the original line, thence the original line to the Ellijay road, thence the Ellijay road north to the forks of the road, thence the churchhouse road east back to the starting point also the right of way to the spring or the place of getting water.

We have and to hold said land and premises to the said Baptist church in any manner belonging to their own purpose use, benefit, forever in fee simple and the said Keeter and Gaddis for themselves, their heirs, executors administrators will warrant and forever defend the right and title thereof against themselves and against the claims of all other person or persons whomsoever in testimony thereof we have set our hands and fixed our seals the date above written.
